## McKenzie Friend Presentation Template

Use the following to prepare and present an argument to the judge for the acceptance of your McKenzie Friend.

You can **customize** this statement to your situation, then **print it**, and **read it in court**.

Your Honour, I would like to request a support person, also known as a McKenzie Friend, to help me today.

The legal case that established the principle of the McKenzie Friend is: McKenzie v McKenzie (1970) 3 W.L.R. 472. [Which you would read out in court as "year 1970, volume 3, Weekly Law Reports, page 472"]

I understand that support people, known as McKenzie Friends, are usually friends, family members or sometimes community justice workers who can sit beside self-represented litigants in a courtroom.

I know they aren't allowed to address the court, and they are not here to give me legal advice.
